Students had emphasized on the importance of the 5 pillars of Islam and the last 10 days of Ramadan.

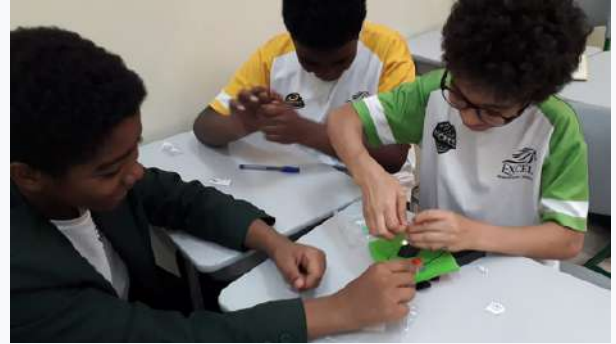
Ramadan Activities

The students had a group activity on how plants adapt to different environments.

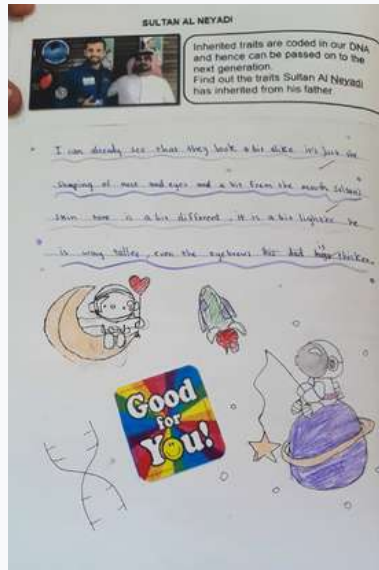

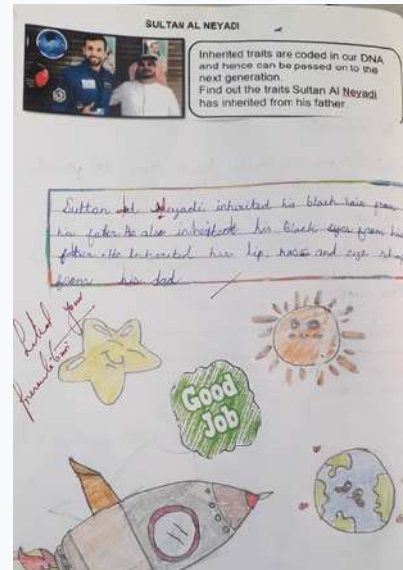

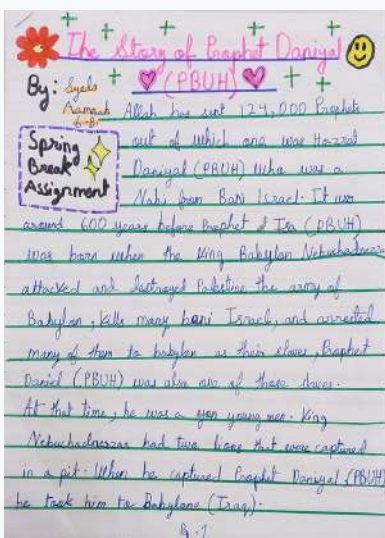


As Sultan Al Neyadi celebrated his first birthday in space with his colleagues, our students joined along in the celebration by making beautiful birthday cards.

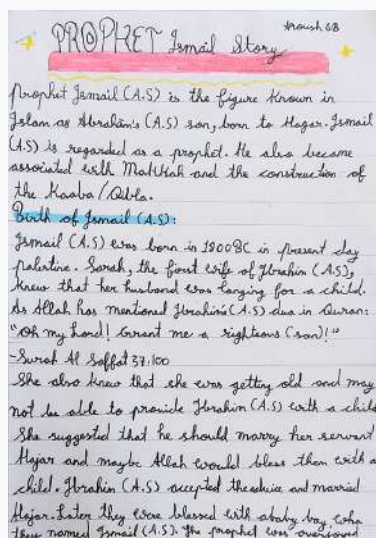


Sultan Al Neyadi is the longest-serving Arab astronaut, who has skillfully navigated through a series of firsts, setting a list of achievements.

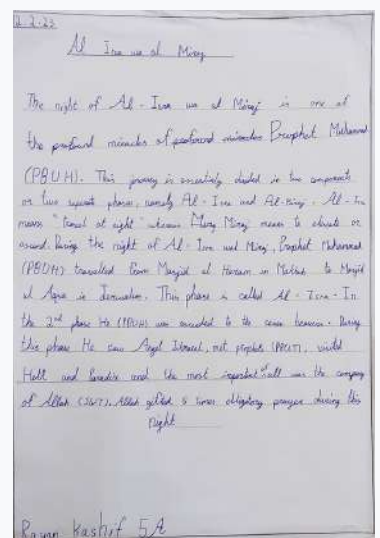

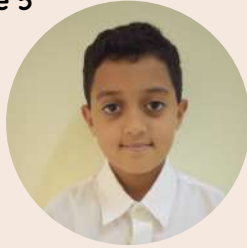
