



As Sultan Al Neyadi celebrated his first birthday in space with his colleagues, our students joined along in the celebration by making beautiful birthday cards.






Sultan Al Neyadi is the longest- serving Arab astronaut, who has skillfully navigated through a series of firsts, setting a list of achievements.


