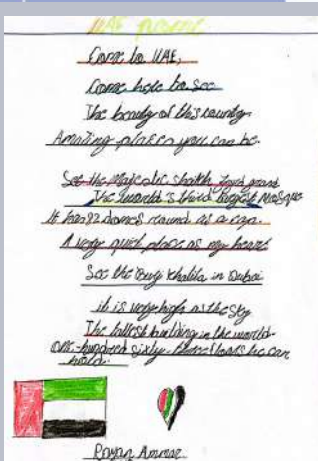
PE Activities: Obstacle Race



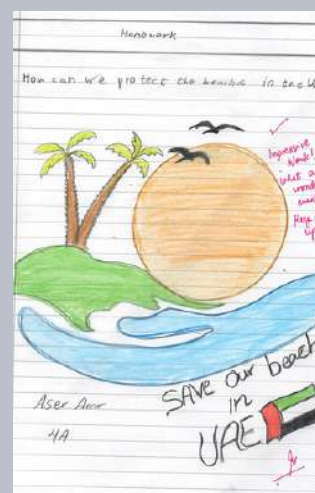

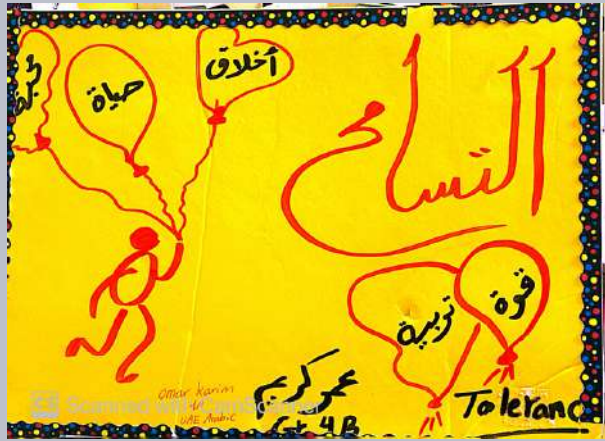

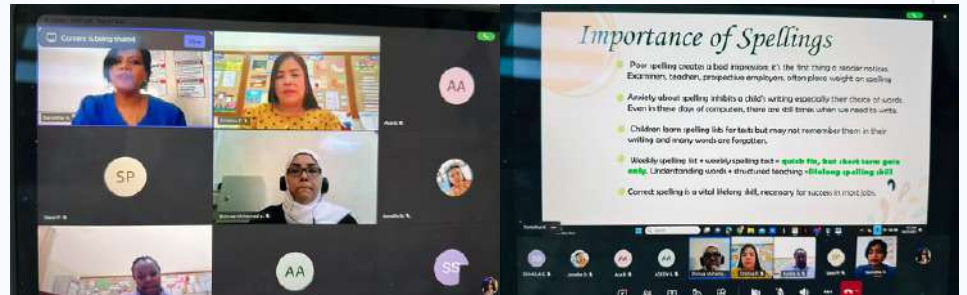


Parent-Teacher Association (PTA) Meeting
